Aces high as Red Arrows salute the D-Day village



THE CRACK RAF Red Arrows display team has sent a SOS message to villagers at Droxford.

'We'll Save Our Smoke for you," they have promised as they roar over the D-Day village at 500 feet.

They are booked to perform their precision aerobatics over Southsea and The Solent on June 5 in honour of the 70th Anniversary of D-Day.

But when they learned about the Hampshire rural village's key role in the run-up to the greatest military invasion in history, they agreed to change their flight plan on the way back.

They will now set course up the old Meon Valley Railway line and pass above Droxford at precisely 14.26.

And they will save some of the red white and blue smoke they use to blaze their trails across the sky especially for Droxford, where the Allied leaders spent 2 days putting the final touches to 'Overlord' on board Churchill's special train parked in a hidden siding.

It will be a double anniversary for the world-famous team which is celebrating 50 years of breath-taking precision aerobatics with a new tail fin design incorporating the Union Flag.

For Droxford, it will be a one-off occasion, all over in seconds, so don't be late!
