

Variations in Church History

Chancel Windows

VCH – clearstory windows of the chancel re-modelled in the 18th century – internal masonry probably of 15th century, but externally of 18th century

Some Hampshire Churches – during incumbency of Stephen Bridge (1868 to 1886)

Memorabilia – four square windows cut in north and south walls of chancel between 1868 and 1886

Pevsner – no comment

Roofs & Ceilings

VCH – roofs of church seem to have been entirely renewed in 18th century - plaster cornices and ceilings added

Some Hampshire Churches – new roofs and ceilings fitted, together with plaster cornices

Memorabilia – 1847 – new roof and ceiling – plaster cornices

Pevsner – Chancel roof altered in Georgian times – clerestoried chancel has a distinctive roof line with Georgian coved cornice and boldly projecting eaves characteristic of some early 18th century domestic architecture of the district

Side Aisles & Windows

Pevsner – aisles rebuilt in the 15th century – windows of the aisles are Perp

VCH – aisles widened late 15th or early 16th centuries

Window Segments

VCH - two round-headed lights, the original south windows of the chancel, with wide internal splays

Pevsner – parts of the splays of two blocked Norman windows
