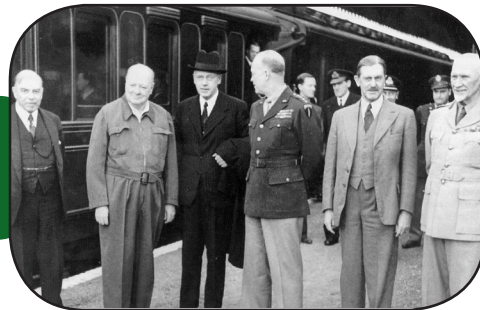


D-DAY AT



DROXFORD

70 years on, a solitary bench marks historic site where D-Day plans were finalised



TWO TEENAGERS sit on a bench beside a picturesque bridle path, oblivious of the drama played out there 70 years ago.

Now picture this scene 4 days before D-Day in 1944.

The muddy track on the left carried the Meon Valley railway line 26 miles from Fareham to Alton.

The one on the right was known simply as Up Siding No 1.

On June 2, 1944 Winston Churchill's wartime train arrived at the rural Droxford Station 200 yards back up the line with the Allied leaders on board.

The carriages in LMS livery were shunted into the siding and stood there for 48 hours, protected by trees and a deep cutting.

Then the train, codenamed 'Rugged', steamed back to Waterloo and Droxford's tiny station – now in private ownership and beautifully restored - returned to its bucolic slumber until the line was finally closed in 1962.

Today, only the bench marks the spot where the leaders conferred and put the final touches to the greatest invasion in military history that was to liberate Europe from Nazi tyranny.

- Kids will love rides on carriages hauled by a LMS steam train as it puffs away from a replica of Droxford Station

- In the church, Fareham Model Railway Club will operate their 33ft long 00-gauge model of the Meon Valley Railway, there will be an exhibition of historic pictures associated with Droxford's part in D-Day and project work by children at Droxford Junior School
