In the Third (the King's) Battalion of the English Army at this battle rode Sir John de Drokenesford, Banneret and Keeper of the Wardrobe, with the following retinue:

- Sir John de Drokenesford on a great 'powis' warhorse (worth £20.00)
- Sir Roger le Sauvage (Knight) on a bay horse (worth £20.00)
- Sir Hugh de S Philibert (Knight) on a dun horse (worth £26.66)
- Sir John de Scures (Knight) (from Wickham, Hants) on a dappled horse (worth £20.00)
- John Flambarde on a black horse with three white feet (worth £13.66)
- Henry de Farnhull on a bay horse with a star on its head (£13.66)
- Michael de Drokenesford (John's brother) on a white horse (£12.00)
- Hamo Lestmor on a piebald red horse (£10.00)
- Thomas Launceleveie on a black horse (£12.00)
- Thomas de Burhunte (Boarhunt) on an iron-spotted horse (£12.00)
- John le Savage on a white horse (£12.00)
- James de Molendinis on a bay horse (£8.00)
- Stephen de Bannebury on an iron-spotted horse (£10.00)
- Walter de Wyndesore on a bay horse (£10.00)
- John de Lourmere on a black horse with white back feet (£5.00) (ie from Lomer village, now deserted, on Beacon Hill, Exton)
- William de Faucomberge on a brown bay horse (£6.66)
- Henry Urry on a black horse (£6.66)
- John Dureme on a black horse (£6.66)
- Robert de Hamme on a spotted horse (£6.66)
- Richard de la More on a sorrel horse (£10.00)
- Gilbert Wuderove on a sorrel horse (£4.00)
- Walter de Bedewynde on a black horse with one white back foot (£8.00)
- Adam de Stanie on a black horse (£6.66)
- Benedict de Blakenham on on a sorrel horse with a head-star (£9.33)
- Richard de Coleshulle on a sorrel horse with four white feet (£5.33)
- Thomas de Burewell on a bay horse (£8.00)

(Note: the above horse values have been converted to decimal coinage from the 'marks'; ie 1 mark = 66p, in which they are listed in the records.)
